Kalamazoo Art League's Membership Celebration Presents:

World Art Adventure With Robert Duncan



For 38 days in 2015, Robert and Karen Duncan, and their friends Kathryn and Mark, flew around the world in the Duncans' modern art inspired plane, 'Hummingbird,' meeting with artists in far-off lands, and collecting contemporary sculptures for the Duncans' private collection.

The arts—music, performance, written, and visual arts—have been central to the Duncans' lives for many years. Their rolling 40-acre estate in Lincoln, Iowa has become home to a world-class contemporary sculpture garden—including nearly 2,000 works—that is ranked among the 50 best in the country.

In recent years, at an auction in Clarinda, Iowa, where they both grew up, the Duncans purchased the original Carnegie Library. They have restored it for a private gallery—a way to open more of their extensive collections of art and books (over 10,000) to the community while preserving a national treasure. Known as the Clarinda Carnegie Art Museum, it opened to the public in 2014.

During our very special season opening event, Robert Duncan, chair emeritus of Duncan Aviation, Inc., will share the adventures he and Karen, and their friends, experienced during their around-the-world-in-38-days adventure. He will introduce us to cities and countries they visited, share stories of some of the artists they met, and describe reasons pieces were selected for their collection.

Please help welcome the Duncans and their artist guests during the Membership Celebration Reception following the lecture where new and renewing members will kick off the new season in style!

As a special bonus, the Duncans' plane will be at the Kalamazoo Airport sometime during their visit. Check our Facebook page for specific information about when and where.

Herman Miller Picnic Posters with Steve Frykholm



For graphic designer Steve Frykholm, work at Herman Miller started with a picnic. As the company's first internal graphic designer, he was asked to create a poster for the company's annual event. It was the first of over 20 picnic posters, so unique, original, inventive, imaginative, and compelling that they have been collected by countless museums from New York to San Francisco, and many in between.

Steve Frykholm will talk about his years at Herman Miller—including how he learned the art of silkscreen, value of simplicity, and the universal communication posters can offer—while providing artistic insights and commentary as fresh as his posters.

Mr. Frykholm joined Herman Miller in 1970 and retired in 2015, receiving many awards along the way. Steve earned a BFA from Bradley University, and MFA from Cranbrook Academy of Art.

The Art of Maps 1500–1900 with Brian Leigh Dunnigan



Brian Dunnigan personifies a life-long love of history. He earned several degrees in history and museum studies—and served as director of two historic sites—before joining the University of Michigan more 20 years ago. He serves as curator of maps and associate director of the Clements Library.

A Michigan native, Mr. Dunnigan focuses his investigations, books, and articles on our region—especially the Straits of Mackinaw, Niagra River area, and the early Great Lakes.

A current special interest is pre-photographic maps, prints, and sketches of the area, which he will share with us in *The Art of Maps 1500–1900*.

Mr. Dunnigan lives in Jackson and on Mackinaw Island with his wife, Candice, and their two children, James and Claire.
